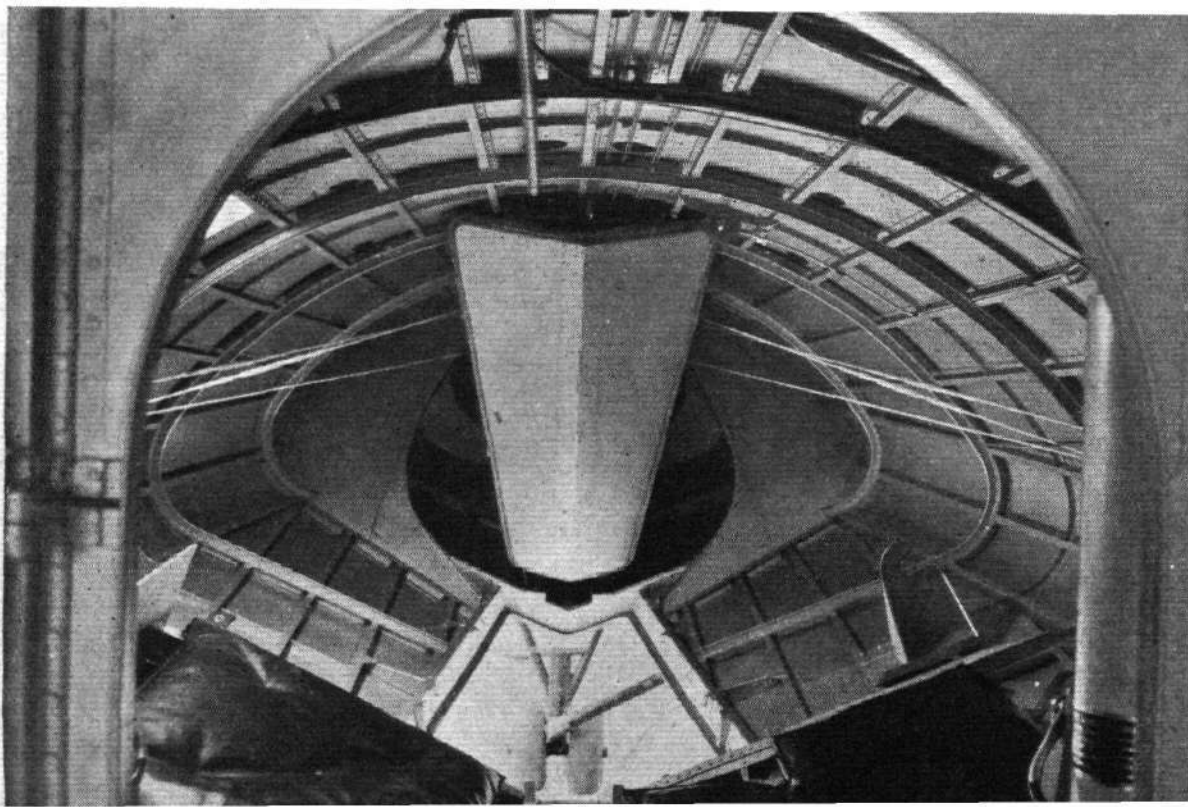
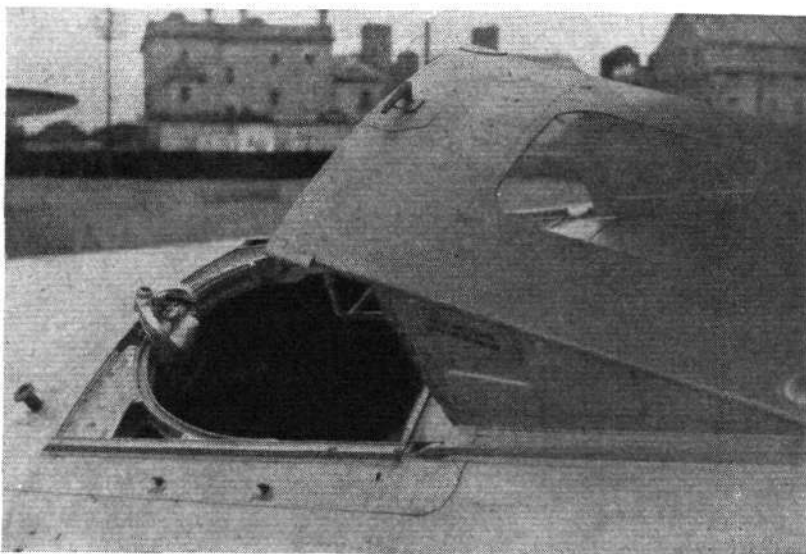
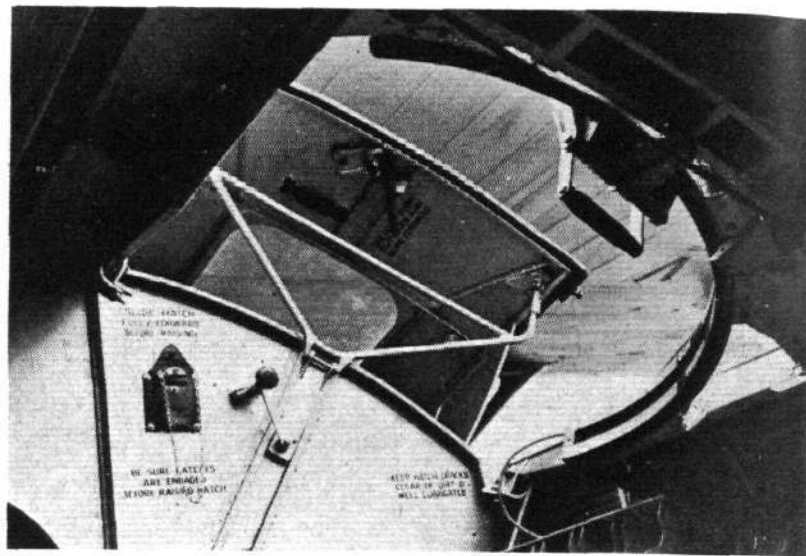
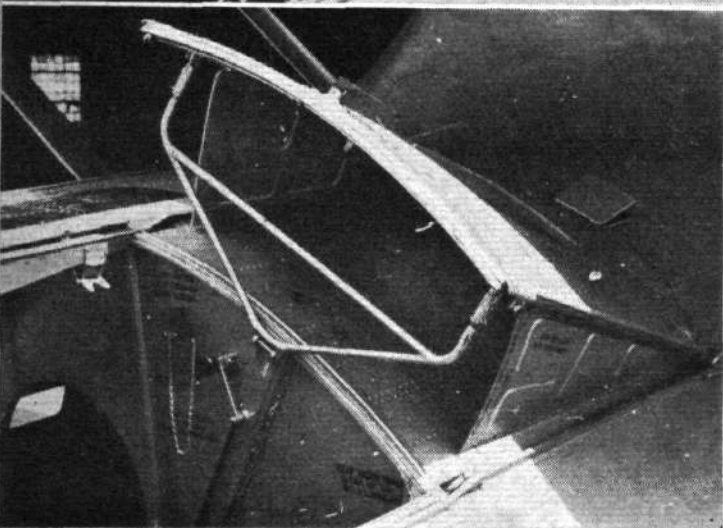
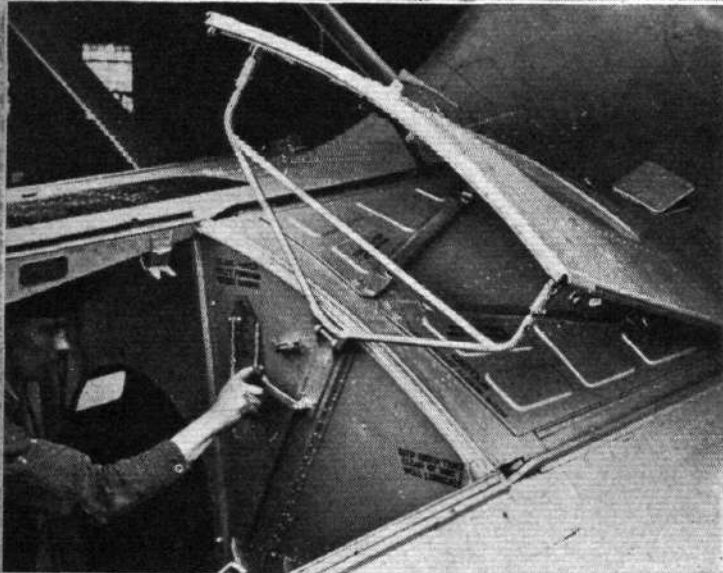
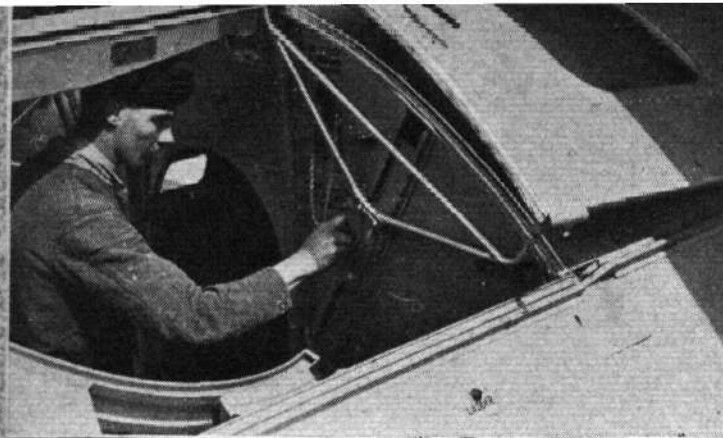


Five views of one of the two deck gun positions. On the left the portion of decking which protects the gunner from the airstream is shown being raised after having been slid forward. The third view shows the side plates in position. Below is a "shot" of the gunner's position from inside the hull and below that is a view showing everything ready for action, except that the gun is not fitted to the track-type mounting which, incidentally, operates very smoothly.



(Left) This is what the Americans call the tunnel gun position. Actually it is not so much a tunnel as an aperture in the floor which is normally filled by the folding section of hull seen above it. This view also shows the section and construction of the rear portion of the hull.
